Budget Narrative

Personnel

a. Personnel consist primarily of salaries (\$3,600) associated with staff time to carry out the activities specified in the approach section. This includes most of the personal service costs associated with the Regional Hunter Education. Other agency staff will charge time to the project when participating in the planning, management, and delivery of the program.

Fringe

a. Fringe for all salaried and match employees was budgeted at 40%.

Fringe benefits (\$1,400) consist of the required employer contribution of Social Security, Medicare, unemployment tax, retirement, and employee health insurance, and is estimated at 30.0% of salaries

Travel

a. Vehicle mileage (\$2,000) was computed as 4,000 miles x \$0.50 per mile to commute back and forth between employee's headquarters and the range

Program Narrative

Need

Alabama is quickly becoming a highly urbanized state as a result of changes in the economy, industry, and other factors leading to a shift away from a rural way of life. Access to shooting ranges in Alabama is limited, especially in these increasingly urbanized areas. The Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries operates five shooting ranges on state owned property and five in cooperation with wildlife management area lessors. In addition, the U.S. Forest Service operates five shooting ranges on its property throughout Alabama. There are very few privately operated shooting ranges in and around Alabama's major metropolitan areas.

WFF operates thirteen community archery parks in cooperation with City Parks and Recreation Departments, and two in cooperation with our State parks. These facilities are highly utilized and increase the visibility of archery within the respective communities.

Access to archery ranges, although not as impaired as firearms ranges, is becoming increasingly more difficult because of city ordinances. It is essential that the Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries take action to develop and maintain additional shooting opportunities for the citizens of Alabama. Failure to develop additional public shooting ranges will result in decreased shooting opportunities and degradation of our shooting and hunting heritage. Lack of convenient locations to participate could be a barrier that prevents some individuals from becoming involved in the shooting sports.

Approach

The Lakepoint Archery Park project involves approximately 3 acres, more or less. The site is located at 31° 59'44.06" N and 85° 07'22.75" W.

The range will be developed through a partnership with State Parks and the Bowhunters of Alabama, Barbour County Chapter (BHA). Our agency will pay for materials for all archery related structures including the elevated platform, target frames, targets and other archery related items. Construction will be donated from a local vendor who is affiliated with BHA. Installation of target frames, bow racks and ground quivers and other archery related items will be done by WFF staff. In addition, the park will provide routine maintenance such as grass cutting and litter removal. Discussions are underway to involve the Archery Trade Association as a partner in this project.

Results or benefits expected

The construction of a community archery park in Barbour County will result in increased public access to an archery range. This range should enhance efforts to initiate participation of Barbour County Schools in Alabama's National Archery in the Schools Program. The construction of this range should allow archers more opportunity to enjoy the recreational aspects of our shooting heritage and also provide a location for hunters to prepare for hunting season. In addition, it should also improve the visibility of archery as a recreational activity that is part of mainstream America.

Objective

1. Archery Range Construction

To construct/develop a 50-yard archery range on State Park Property in Barbour County. The ranges will adhere to guidelines set forth by the Americans with Disabilities Act. Lakepoint State Park Employees will operate and maintain the archery range throughout its useful life. The State Park and BHA will develop programming to provide youth and adults an opportunity to become involved in various facets of archery.

Useful life

The Useful life of the Lakepoint Community Archery park archery range shall be 15 years, beginning from the date of completion of the project.

Geographic location.

Lakepoint State Park lies in Barbour County (population 25,270) in Southeast Alabama. The site is located at 31° 59'44.06" N and 85° 07'22.75" W.

Estimated expenditures for this project are approximately \$120,000. Hunter Education Funds (Section 4) in the above amount are available and will be used for this construction project. Federal Share will be \$90,000. The match will be provided with in kind services from Alabama State Parks and BHA affiliates.

Within the spirit and intent of the Council on Environmental Quality's regulations for implementing the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), and other statutes, orders, and policies that protect fish and wildlife resources, I have established the following administrative record and determined that the following proposed action is categorically excluded from NEPA documentation requirements consistent with 40 CFR 1508.4, 516 DM 2.3A, 516 DM 2 Appendix 1, and 516 DM 8.5 Appendix 1.4.

The Lakepoint Community Archery Park will consist of youth and adult ranges with targets from 5-20 and 15-50 yards, respectively. An elevated platform with targets from 10-40 yards will also be available to offer bowhunters an opportunity to shoot from a simulated treestand environment.

The proposed site is located on approximately 3 acres within Lakepoint State Park in Barbour County. This site was one of several proposed locations and was selected because of safety requirements and its visibility to the public.

The site is located in Lakepoint State Park operated by Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. The addition of the archery park will not negatively impact the capacity of the Park to carryout their mission in regards to other recreational activities currently conducted on site. The project will enhance recreational opportunities available to residents of Barbour County. The only change will be enhanced access to archery related activities as opposed to minor foot traffic by picnickers or nature enthusiasts.

The Ecological Services Office in Daphne has been notified and requested to provide input regarding the proposed site. Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries staff members have not identified any negative impacts to threatened or endangered species or habitats. To the best of our knowledge, no additional permits or approvals other than Federal Assistance are required prior to development of the archery park.

APPENDIX A

Affected Environment: Madison County Community Archery Park

PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY

- 1. The design of the known distance range is identical to other Community Archery Parks constructed in Alabama during the past ten years. Original plans were developed after consulting with members of the Archery Shooters Association and Bowhunters of Alabama.
- 2. All use areas will be in compliance with ADA requirements.
- 3. Firing lines will be clearly marked and maintained. Alabama Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries (WFF) will provide all targets in order to maintain a safe direction of fire. WFF and Lakepoint State Park should be able to manage this area and ensure such management continues to provide for public health and safety. Additionally, the access point to the range will be located behind the firing line. WFF and Lakepoint State Park do not plan to staff the range; however, strict guidelines for range use will be posted at the site. In addition, WFF and Park employees will monitor use through random spot checks to ensure compliance.
- 4. The perimeter will be posted with signs indicating that the area is an archery range.
- 5. Maps of the property will depict the range and safety zone.

HISTORIC OR CULTURAL RESOURCES

The known distance range site is currently open fields with shrubs and small trees such as oaks, pines, privet and other species. The archery park will be constructed by selectively clearing above-ground vegetation as needed, including some mid-story flora, and controlling such vegetation with mowers, fire, and herbicide. Construction and management of the range will not require significant ground disturbance.

LISTED SPECIES

Information regarding this project has been sent to the ES Field Office in Daphne, AL. WFF has investigated the property and found no evidence of listed species or critical habitat.

OTHER WILDLIFE

The area will continue to be managed under current use and guidelines. Grasses on the range will provide foraging areas for wildlife such as songbirds, wild turkey, Bobwhite quail and whitetail deer. Management of the area as an archery range is not expected to have any negative impacts on wildlife species utilizing the area.

NOISE

Since the range is archery only, there will be no noise impacts or concerns.

WETLANDS

The archery range will not impact any wetland areas. The site is upland in nature with a mixture of various oak and pine species. The primary soil at this site is Bonifay Loamy Sand and Luverne Springhill Complex.

LAND USE

The proposed site is currently part of Lakepoint State Park. The land is not actively managed for any wildlife management objectives other than providing shrub and low basal area forested habitat. Since this is an archery only range, there will not be any deposition of lead on the area from archery related activities.

PUBLIC NOTICE

WFF met with park employees to discuss the proposed Community Archery Park. Park employees have also met with local citizens to discuss their vision for development and maintenance of the community archery park along with anticipated programming activities as part of their programming efforts. A formal notice was not distributed to local citizens regarding the proposed archery park because there were no concerns regarding noise, lead issues, or other concerns that may be present when a firearms range is being constructed.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN THE

ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES,

DIVISION OF WILDLIFE AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES AND THE

ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES, STATE PARKS DIVISION

THIS Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) entered into this day of
, 2018, between the State Of Alabama, State Parks Division
hereinafter called Parks, and the State of Alabama, Department of Conservation and
Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries, hereinafter called WFF:
WHEREAS, WFF and Parks jointly desire to develop, use and maintain a public
archery park on certain lands within Lakepoint State Park; and

WHEREAS, WFF and Parks jointly desire to use the lands in a manner compatible with the primary purpose of the park and to construct archery shooting lanes and targets, a pavilion for groups to use and other facilities that would support wildlife related activities; and

WHEREAS, WFF and Parks desire to develop a plan to integrate the area into the Alabama Archery Park Plan; and

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That WFF and Parks do hereby agree for the construction and maintenance of a public archery park area within the property delineated in the attached "Exhibit A" situated in Barbour County, Alabama.:

Said MOU is made under the following specific terms, conditions and stipulations:

- Parks hereby grants WFF use of the following property: a mutually agreed upon site within Lakepoint State Park for the purpose of the development and maintenance of a public archery range.
- 2. The term of this MOU shall commence on the date hereof and shall expire fifteen (15) years thereafter; provided however, that WFF shall have the right to renew said MOU for two (2) additional fifteen (15) year periods. The property shall be made available for public use by the general public as a public archery range, during normal operating hours. All laws and regulations shall apply. Parks shall provide all routine maintenance of the premises including, but not limited to, litter clean-up and grass mowing, and shall be responsible for providing public access to the public archery range facilities. Standard park day use fees will be charged for the public use of the archery range unless waived by the Parks Director.
- 3. WFF agrees to pay for materials for all archery related structures including the elevated platform, target frames, targets and other archery related items. Construction of the elevated platform and target frames will be donated from a local vendor. Installation of target frames, bow racks, ground quivers and other archery related items will be completed by WFF staff and a local vendor. Future repair of the archery facilities will be split in cost share between Parks and WFF.
- This agreement may not be amended or otherwise altered without the express written consent of the parties.

- 5. This agreement may not be assigned or otherwise transferred without the express written consent of the parties.
- 6. By signing this contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they will not violate federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom.
- 7. During the contract term, including any renewals or extension, Contractor will not engage in the boycott of a person or an entity based in or doing business with a jurisdiction with whom the State of Alabama can enjoy open trade, as defined in Act 2016-312.
- 8. For any and all disputes arising under the terms of this agreement, the parties hereto agree, in compliance with the recommendation of the Governor and Attorney General, when considering settlement of such disputes, to utilize appropriate forms of non-binding alternative dispute resolution including, but not limited to, mediation by and through the Attorney General's Office of Administration hearing or where appropriate, private mediators.
